ASSESSMENT

Assessment for Cambridge IGCSE includes written and oral tests, coursework and practical assessment. Coursework is set and marked by the teacher and externally moderated by Cambridge.

Each learner's performance is benchmarked using eight internationally recognized grades. There are clear guidelines which explain the standard of achievement for different grades.

Cambridge IGCSE examination sessions take place twice a year, in May / June and October / November. The results are release in August and January.

A'LEVELS OVERVIEW

Moving into A' level is a significant and exciting step. Students have more control and choice about what they will study than they have had so far in their school life, and students will also be given more responsibility – both in their assigned homework/assignments and outside the classroom.

In A' Level students are laying their foundations for university and beyond by obtaining AS and A-level qualifications. Therefore, it is important that they make careful and sensible decisions about the subjects they will study the next year.



Aims of A' Level curriculum:

- To provide a curriculum which is appropriate for each pupil in its range and demands.
- To develop academic skills that can be use in an increasingly challenged independent study, research & thought.
- To encourage and develop personal skills to allow a confident entry into higher education and to create adaptability and resilience befitting the realities of working life in the 21st century.
- To encourage pupils to consider and discuss issues relevant to them as they move towards adulthood and participate in full range of rights and responsibilities as citizens.

Students typically sit for As-Level examinations in their chosen subjects at the end of Year 12 and A' Level exams at the end of Year 13.

Students are free to choose up to four subjects from a list of options that includes Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, English Literature, Geography, History, Business Studies, Economics, Foreign Languages, Music, Drama, Performing Arts, Media Studies and Physical Education.



AS/A-LEVEL OPTIONS

Typically, an AS-Level is completed in one year, and extended to an A-Level in the second year. The majority of students will take 4 subjects in Year 12 (AS-Level) and continue 3 of these subjects to A-Level in Year 13.

We are keen to ensure we select the syllabuses that best suit our students. This includes:

Entry Requirements

These entry requirements are guidelines and we will review student's applications on a case-by-case basis.

- Five (I)GCSEs A*-C
- A minimum of grade B at (I)GCSE in subjects you wish to take for A-Level
- A*/A in IGCSE mathematics necessary to take Further Mathematics A-Level

Assessment

Each subject that a student takes receives a separate grade. Grades are benchmarked using internationally recognized standards, which have clear guidelines to explain the levels of achievement.

A-Levels are reported on a grade scale from A* (highest) to E (minimum required performance). There is no A* grade for AS Levels which run from grade A to E.



SCHOOL TRANSPORT

ADMISSIONS & ENROLMENT

ADMISSIONS OFFICE For new students and their families, the Admissions Office is usually the first point of contact in BIS. ENROLMENT PROCEDURE

Families who are interested in sending their children to BIS should first contact the Brighton International School (BIS) Admissions Office, called Brighton Central. Where possible, an appointment should be made for an interview to discuss the transfer and to see the school.

The Application Form should be completed and sent in with the application fee, IC/Passport copy, child birth certificate and school report from the last school attended.

Upon receipt of the said documents, an appointment will be made with the relevant member of the Administration to arrange a placement. Previous school records are important to all decisions in the admissions process and, where possible, should be submitted with the application.

Students are accepted throughout the year but will be placed in a grade or class according to the assessment made by the administration, performance in the previous school attended and after placement testing in English.
